

Lesson Requirements

Safety is one of our utmost concerns at Sunburst. Students that feel they can ski or ride safely and in a controlled manner will have the opportunity to "test out" of the lesson program. To "test out" the student will ski or ride a predetermined course where the instructor will give direction and critique the student. The instructor determines if a student is qualified or if they need to work on specific skills. When qualified the student will receive a blue sticker. The blue sticker signifies the student is done with lessons and is able to free ski on the evenings the group is at Sunburst. If not, the student will start zone lessons in the appropriate place.

Refunds / Missed Nights

Refunds will not be given to any student removed from a club due to disciplinary reasons invoked by the School Advisor, Sunburst Ski Patrol or Sunburst Management. Due to the nature of this program we are unable to offer make up days for missed nights. Please check your calendars before making a commitment to this program.

Responsibility Code

Sunburst is committed to promoting slope safety. Skiing can be enjoyed in many ways. At Sunburst you may see people alpine, snowboard, telemark, cross country, or using other specialized ski equipment. Regardless of how you decide to enjoy the slopes, always show courtesy to others and be aware that there are elements of risk in snow sports that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Know your ability and stay within it. Observe your responsibility code listed below and share with others on the slopes the responsibility for a great snow sports experience.

1. Always stay in control and be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
2. People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
3. You must not stop where you obstruct a trail, or are not visible from above.
4. Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
5. Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
6. Observe all posted signs & warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
7. Prior to using any lift, you must have knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.

This program is offered for four consecutive weeks, students participate in a one hour lesson each week, allowing for ample practice time afterwards. Helpful Hints for a Day on the Slopes!

What to wear:

Hat or helmet – Up to 60% of your body heat can escape from an uncovered head. Wearing a hat or helmet is essential to staying warm and safe. The old saying "If your feet are cold, put on a hat" is true!

Helmets should fit snugly without a hat on underneath. Helmets are available for rental and are highly recommended.

Gloves/Mittens – Gloves allow more freedom of movement, but mittens are warmer - either way waterproof is best. Avoid knit gloves as they get wet very quickly.

Eye protection - Either sunglasses or goggles. Sunglasses help protect on bright days. Goggles will be warmer and are tinted to help you see better in flat light; great for cloudy or snowy days! (Remember we make snow in Wisconsin so there's always a chance that it's snowing at Sunburst!)

Socks - High socks preferably wool or synthetic (cotton gets wet and stays wet when you sweat) Wearing only one pair is best. Avoid socks with big, thick seams if possible.

Dress in Layers:

#1 First or Base Layer – Synthetic (polypropylene), silk or wool base layers (long underwear or tights) for next to the skin - it's better to be warm than cold, you can always shed layers. Synthetic materials help take moisture away from your skin to keep you dry. Avoid cotton next to your skin as it tends to get wet and stay wet making you COLD!

#2 Middle or Insulating Layer – This layer includes clothing made of fleece or wool to keep the heat in and the cold out by trapping air between the clothing fibers. Good choices are sweaters, sweatshirts, vests and pullovers.

#3 Outer or Protection Layer - This layer includes a jacket & outer pants. Snow pants or nylon pants are ideal, as they will help keep you warm and dry. (Make sure pants are wide enough at the bottom to fit over boots.)

What to Bring:

Here are some ideas of items for you to bring skiing or snowboarding in order to help guarantee a fun day on the slopes.

- Sunscreen and lip balm- SPF 15 or higher. Even on cloudy days it is very easy to get too much sun when on the snow.
- Snack, fruit, energy bar
- ID, wallet, money or major credit card.
- Extra clothes, shoes - to change into for the ride home!
- Quarters for the lockers if you are using them.
- Camera

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF HAZARDS AND ASSUMPTION OF RISKS

I understand that all forms of alpine activities are **HAZARDOUS** with many dangers and risks including but not limited to: skiing and snowboarding and snowtubing, mini bobbing, competing in contests, riding, and disembarking ski lifts, changing weather conditions, variations in terrain, surface or subsurface snow or ice conditions, bare spots, rocks, trees, stumps and other forms of forest growth or debris, lift towers and components thereof, buildings and fences, parked or operating vehicles, pole lines and plainly marked or visible snowmaking equipment (all of the foregoing whether above or below the snow surface), collisions with other persons and a multitude of other objects are inherent to all forms of alpine activities. I further understand that collisions with other persons and a multitude of other objects are a greater **DANGER**. I further understand that the snowboard boot/binding systems are **NOT INTENDED TO RELEASE** in a fall or on impact and agree that this is an inherent feature of the sport of snowboarding. I understand that the ski boot/binding system **may not release under all circumstances** and agree that this is an inherent feature of the sport of skiing. I fully accept these and all risks and freely and voluntarily **ASSUME ALL RISKS OF PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH** which result in any way from negligence, condition of equipment, weather and snow conditions, conditions on or about the premises, the operation of the facilities including but not limited to grooming, snowmaking and lift operations and actions or omissions of employees or my participation in this recreational activity.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT AND WARNING ABOUT HELMETS!

I have received the equipment listed on this agreement and have been instructed on its use. I verify that the personal information (height, weight, age and head size) are correct. I have confirmed that the fit has been done in accordance with available measuring devices and have received instructions on its use including the fact that I must **wear the chin strap buckled** at all times when skiing or snowboarding. I agree that the **helmet fit is snug yet comfortable**. I understand that **helmet use can not guard against** all foreseeable impacts and head injuries or from neck, spine or other injuries that may result from skiing or snowboarding. **I understand that at any speed, especially speeds in excess of 13 miles per hour, my helmet may not provide adequate protection against serious head injury if my head comes into contact with any object, fixed or unfixed.**

Horning Ski/Snowboard Club 2011-2012



Another ski and snowboarding season is fast approaching and the Horning Ski Club is looking forward to a fun and exciting season. The club is offered to 6th, 7th and 8th grade students. Horning participates in the Learn to Snowboard/Ski program at Sunburst Ski hill in Kewaskum, WI. This program is designed to introduce students to the exciting sport of downhill skiing or snowboarding. Students participate in a series of 4, one hour lessons that are designed to teach beginning students the basics of skiing or boarding safely. After each lesson, students will have two hours to practice what they have learned each week. Students who are experienced skiers/snowboarders will have the opportunity to test out of the lessons early.

Dates: Thursdays, Jan. 5th, Jan. 12th, Jan. 19th, and Jan 26th.

Time: 3:00 pm – 8:00 pm

Limit: 100 students

*Helmet rental- \$20 extra for the entire season

Whether students ski or snowboard, helmets are required for all participants. No student will be allowed on the hill without this essential piece of safety equipment.

Trip Procedures:

On ski days, the boys' bathroom by the choir room will be open by 7:00 am for ski/equipment storage. Students will need to bring all of their equipment with them in the morning because there will not be time after school to go home and get it. This room will remain locked until after school. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** This is to insure that everyone's equipment is safe.

Everyone who is going on the trip should be in the cafeteria by 2:45. No one is to be roaming the halls. The bus will leave promptly at 2:55.

Students should make sure to have a ride waiting for them when we return from the trips. Rides should be waiting in the parking lot between Horning and Banting. Under ideal conditions on Thursday night trips, we should arrive back at about **8:00 p.m.**

Ski trips will be canceled for the following reasons:

1. School has been canceled for the day
2. The temperature at noon of the ski day is 10 degrees or less.
3. Wind chill at noon on ski day is -20 degrees or less.
4. Travel conditions are hazardous

Horning Ski Club Rules of Conduct:

Please be aware that due to the nature of this activity, chaperones are not able to keep students under direct supervision at all times. This means that students must demonstrate responsible and mature behavior. Membership in Ski Club is a privilege that may be withdrawn. All students must act appropriately. Failure



to follow these rules will result in the student's removal from Ski Club with no refund of money paid. Irresponsible behaviors include, but are not limited to school rules violations - such as public displays of affection, fighting, insubordination, inappropriate language or actions - on the bus or at the hill.

Timeliness: On all trips, we will announce the time of the bus's departure from the hill. We expect students to be on time. Anyone who is late holds up the entire group and may cause us to get back to school late. Students who are late may be excluded from future trips. We make every effort to return to Horning promptly at 8:00 on the Thursday night trips. We appreciate parents' timeliness in picking their kids up from school at this time.

7. Prior to using any lift, you must be able to load, ride, and unload safely.
8. Do not attempt jumps that may cause you to lose control.

Whether students ski or snowboard, in snow sports there is an element of risk. We expect students to use common sense, show courtesy to others, and anticipate dangerous situations before they arise.
